All the rooms have been designed to provide adequate moving space and ample air and light.

2. Residential facility will be provided till the end of the regular academic session including regular exams or 10 months from the start of session, whichever is earlier. Students can come and join two days prior to start of academic session and will be required to vacate Residential rooms within two days after regular exams.

## **RULES AND REGULATION THE DIARY**

The diary is the main form of communication between home and school. Keeping that in mind please remember the following: -

1. The Diary must be brought to school daily and should be maintained carefully.
2. Notices are occasionally sent through the diary.
3. Parents are requested to sign the diary every day and to see that their children do their homework regularly

### **RULES OF CONDUCT**

1. Students are not permitted to bring mobile, cameras, of any kind or any other electronic gadgets, magazines or books, Other than curriculum and study in the school premises. If any student is found in possession of the same it will be treated as an act of misconduct and the principal would take stern action including rustication / expelling the student from the school. In case of an emergency the child can use the school telephone to contact his / her parent with the permission of the school authorities.
2. From time to time the principal will issue instructions in writing or verbal during assembly or in any class or at any time and all students are bound by such instructions. Disobeying such instructions written or verbal will amount to misconduct and the principal can take stern action including rusticating /expelling the student from the school.
3. Teasing, bullying, beating up, victimizing, ragging of any kind, of any student is strictly banned by the school and is a criminal offence such can be punishable by the law. If any student is found guilty of the same, the principal will immediately rusticate / expel the student from the school and also hand over the case to the police.



4. Pupils must follow the school regulation regarding uniform during school hours school excursions sports events and also when travelling to and from school.

5. Pupils are expected to show courtesy and respect to all both in and out of school. They are expected to greet members of the staff and visitors to the school to move aside on the staircase when a teacher passes, and to go in line from one corner of the school to another.

6. Pupils must stand quietly when a teacher enters the class room, reply to the greeting and sit down only when told to do so. Text books and exercise books must be on the pupil's desk before the teacher enters the room.

7. Pupils must bring their books according to their time- table.

8. Running and shouting in the school premises is not allowed.

9. Eating in the classrooms, on the staircase and on verandahs is not allowed unless it is raining.

10. Breakages must be reported to the class teacher. Wanton damage to school property will be charged to the parent.

11. No pupil can leave the school premises during school hours without informing the school authorities and only if accompanied by a parent.

12. Care should be taken to keep the school premises clean.

13. Care should be taken to keep the school premises clean.

14. Till Class IV children are asked to write with pencil only. From Class V onwards Blue or Black Ball Pens are allowed.

### **UNIFORM RULES**

Uniforms are compulsory and are designed to enhance students' personality, self-confidence and self esteem. The school expects the strict and compulsory following of the uniform codes as per the almanac. Tie, Belt, Identity card and school bag with school logo is mandatory.

1. Grade I – IV has shirt for Girls and Boys, shorts for boys and skirts for girls, socks and shoes for all working days except Wednesday and Saturday. Sports uniform includes T-shirt as per the house colour with track pants, socks and shoes on every Wednesday and Saturday.

2. Grade V – X has shirt for girls and boys with trousers for boys and skirts for girls and blazers for both, socks and shoes. Sports uniform includes T-shirt (as per the house colour), track pants, socks and shoes on every Wednesday and Saturday.



## **LIBRARY RULES**

Books will be issued to the students during regular library periods.

The student is expected to take proper care of the book & return the book during the following library period.

In case of the book being lost, the student will either have to replace it or pay for it.

Textbooks, magazines & reference books are not issued. They are to be referred in the library.

Students are expected to handle journals, magazines, reference books etc. in the reading room with care.

## **TRANSPORT RULES**

The school has its own buses which are available for its students as per the availability of seats.

For details of bus route please consult the transport in charge.

### **The following rules will be observed:**

1. The school does not entertain any request for changes in bus stops or bus routes to suite individual conveniences.
2. A notice of one calendar month is required for discontinuation of bus facility by your student.
3. Students waiting for the buses should stay away from the main road until the bus arrives. Buses will not wait for late comers.
4. Objects of any kind are must not be discarded inside or thrown out of the bus. Student will be held responsible for any damage to buses caused by their negligence or deliberate act.
5. Shrieking, shouting or any unruly behavior is never expected of the students. If they are found to be indulging in any in disciplinary activities in the bus the bus services may be withdrawn.

## **COVID PROTOCOLS**

# DISCIPLINE

1. The principal can, in the interest of the school, ask a parent to remove a pupil, or previous to the end of the current term, should the pupil's conduct behavior or influence, in the principal's opinion be in any way detrimental to the principals of the school or should the pupil seem unable or unwilling to profit by the educational advantages of the school.
2. Irregular attendance, habitual lack of interest in school work, words or action departing from the convention of good conduct, insubordination cheating, stealing, misconduct, even outside the premises of the school or any other malpractices, are reasons enough to ask for withdrawal of a student from the school. Parents must ensure that children attend school regularly in compliance with the code of conduct. Frequent absence from class will not be permitted. The principal reserves the right to refuse leave of absence for religious festivals wedding, and other ceremonies at home if it interferes with the pupils work in the school or school discipline.
3. Parents or guardians cannot dictate to the management, and the management has the right to say on what conditions it will admit or retain a student in this school. Student must not take part in any political activities.
4. Any student who is persistently and repeatedly or willingly mischievous or guilty of malpractice in connection with examinations or has committed an act of serious indiscipline or misbehavior, or who in the opinion of the principal, has an unwholesome influence on the students, may be expelled permanently or removed for a specified period by the principal on the advice of the administration.
5. Student's access to networking sites must be strictly monitored by the parents. Any defamatory content, uploads etc made by students on any site will qualify for dismissal from the school.
6. Tattoos, henna and colouring of hair is not be permitted.



## **CARE OF SCHOOL PROPERTY**

1. Students should take special care of the school property such as furniture, curtains, cupboards, laboratory apparatus etc. With the understanding that we respect whatever is provided to us for our benefit and convenience.

Students are requested to take care of their personal property as the School Authorities do not accept responsibility for loss of books, cloths, money, tiffin carriers etc.

2. Every student is given a personal locker to reduce the burden of carrying to many books to school. It is the student responsibility to maintain these lockers in good condition. Any school property damaged by the students will have to be replaced by them. A fine will be levied for any damage done to any school property.

## **SCHOOL CLEANLINESS**

1. Each student must consider it as their moral responsibility to keep their class, school and also its premises clean for everyone.

2. DWPS is an Eco-friendly school that is committed to protect the environment. Every student must support and maintain this cause. It will be highly appreciable if students display conscious and eco-friendly acts. Ex. Strictly “Say No to Poly Bags”, avoid littering the campus, segregate waste in wet and dry bins, save water and electricity.

3. Every student should particularly be careful to avoid, throwing waste papers, fruit peels etc. out of the windows or on the school ground. Appropriate use should be made of the wastes papers baskets and bins provided for this purpose.



# PUNCTUALITY

1. The hours for class are from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
2. Students especially those who reside in the vicinity of the school, and are late for School Assembly, will be given two warning notice after which they are liable to be sent home by informing parents telephonically.
3. Students who are absent from school or is five minutes late on more than two occasions will not be admitted to class by the teachers in-charge without the prior permission of the Principal / School Co-ordinator and Discipline In-charge.
4. Students are not permitted to leave the school premises during school hours without the permission of the Principal.
5. The attendance will be taken at the beginning of the morning session and at the afternoon session. Those who are not present at the time or roll call will be marked absent.
6. Students should be punctual to school, any students failing to secure 80 percent attendance in an academic year will not be allowed to appear for the Final Examination. In the case of illness a doctor's certificate must be produced but for any other valid reason prior certificate must be sought from Principal only.



## EXPECTATION OF DWPS FROM STUDENTS

1. **Accept Responsibility** for your appearance, work and conduct.
2. **Respect** the right of other students and teachers.
3. **Resolve** conflicts fairly and without using physical force.
4. **Approach** the necessary authority and **express** your grievances when you are victimized or treated unjustly by other students or teacher.
5. Be **Punctual** and **Submit work on time**. School work and homework has to be completed neatly in time and with the understanding of the subject. Seek help when you have a difficulty understanding the lesson.
6. **Participate** in the various activities of the school such as games, exhibitions, competitions with preparation and enthusiasm.
7. **Plan and Organise** your school bags properly according to the day's time table and complete all the missed work at the first opportunity.
8. **Be Polite** and use gentle words that express your anger and concerns. Think of how you would like to be treated and treat others similarly.
9. **Take good care** of the school's property. It is your school and the facilities are for your benefit.
10. **Refrain** from encouraging and supporting misbehavior as it is the same as misbehaving yourself.
11. **Converse in English** language as it is mandatory within the school campus.
12. Develop a **Positive Attitude** towards your peers, teachers, support staff and contribute to create a caring, safe & happy ethos in the school.





## RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

### **1. The school expects the co-operation of the parents to ensure that:-**

- a. The children come to school regularly, punctually and dressed neatly and correctly.
- b. The children bring to school their books and exercise book which should be properly maintained.
- c. The children do their home work regularly.
- d. The pupils do not go out for entertainment or parties during week days.
- e. Birthday invitations are not distributed during and after school hours in or around the school premises.
- f. Books are donated to the library in lieu of sweets. On the student birthday.
- g. The student's photographs may be printed in connection with the school related matters.
- h. They use social media responsibly and avoid discussing school related matters.

### **2. The school expects the co-operation of the parents to check that:-**

- a. To see the notes, made by the teacher's in school diary and sign on daily basis.
- b. To make their own remarks in the school diary for the information of the teachers.
- c. To go through the books and answer papers of their children regularly and sign them.
3. When writing to the school regarding their children, parents should mention the name of the child, the standard and the division.
4. Parents and guardians are not allowed to see pupils or interview teachers during school hours. Please take prior appointment from the school office, if you wish to do so.
5. Parents should intimate the school of any change in address and telephone number through personal communication or drop message in whatsapp group. They can even mention same in the schools facebook page.
6. Parents must not send presents to teachers.



7. Parents should telephone the school between 9.00 am and 1.00 pm the school telephone no.7391 01 74 74. It would be appreciated if telephone calls are made very sparingly. Please ensure that you come personally to school and fetch your child. The school cannot take the risk of sending your child with any other person. At this time it becomes humanly impossible for our office staff to answer telephone calls from so many parents.

8. No article especially water bottles and tiffin boxes will be accepted at the gate. No enquires will be entertained.

9. Parents are requested to personally pick & drop their children punctually for all school events.

10. Parents are requested not to use their mobile phones and cameras within the school premises

## LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Students should not be kept away from school except for illness. When a child is absent for one or two days, parents are required to intimate the class teacher through the school diary. No separate leave applications need to be made. An absence and leave record for the purpose is given in the diary.

Any absence in excess of two days should be supported by a medical certificate and a letter but an entry in the school diary mentioning the number of days the child is absent is also required.

**Infectious diseases:** A student, returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, should produce a doctor's fitness certificate permitting her/him to attend school. Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to school. However, the exact period of quarantine will depend upon the severity of the infection which should be confirmed by a certified medical practitioner.

## **VERY IMPORTANT**

Half day leave will not be granted for any reason whatsoever even during tests and exams. If a doctor's appointment is required to be taken on a week –day, the child will have to stay away from school the whole day.

## **THE BEGINNING AND END OF TERM**

The dates of opening and closing of school must be strictly observed. Parents are especially asked to note that in the interest of their children and the discipline of the school it is absolutely imperative that they strictly abide by the opening and closing dates of the school. No child may leave the school before the beginning of a holiday (midterm break, Diwali, X'mas & summer vacation) and absolute punctuality is necessary on the reopening of the school. Students NOT present in school on the last day of school and the first day of reopening are liable to have their names struck off the roll.

## **EXAMINATIONS**

1. There are periodic unit test and two terminal examinations including several units of study.
2. Absence from one or more subjects involves the loss of grades for these subjects and excludes the pupil from prizes and awards. Pupils absent from an examination should not be expected to be re-examined.

## **PROMOTIONS**

1. Promotions are decided on the pupil's progress throughout the year based on the periodic tests and the terminal examinations.
2. A pupil unable to cope up may be advised to opt for a change in curriculum.
3. Promotion from class IX will only be done on the basis of the cumulative achievement, level of the student throughout the year in the subjects he/she has been registered for. For promotion, a candidate is required to have obtained at least 35% marks in five subjects including English on the cumulative average and a minimum attendance of 75% of the working days.

## WITHDRAWALS

1. When it is desired to withdraw a child during the course of the academic session, two months prior notice in writing has to be given. However fees for the entire term will be forfeited of withdrawal.

The security deposit paid at the time of admission may be claimed by the parents on withdrawal/transfer of the child from school. Parents stand to forfeit the amount if they do not claim the amount within a month of withdrawal of the child from school.

2. A school leaving certificate will be issued only after the school dues are paid.

3. The latest copy of the paid fee receipt should be attached to the withdrawal form.

## ENTRANCE AND VEHICLE PARKING

Parents are requested for the safety of the children, not to bring their vehicles inside the main entrance.

Children who come to school by car/auto rickshaw/scooter should be dropped and picked up outside the main gates (Gate No 1 & 2)

### **It is further requested that:-**

a. The vehicle should not be parked in front of the gate and right on the school road.

b. No vehicle should be left unattended. If it is necessary to park the vehicle unattended, please park it nearer to the school compound wall.

c. Nobody should bring his / her vehicle inside the campus in any condition.

d. Students of the junior college using a two wheeler must wear a helmet. Parents are requested to co-operate with the traffic warden, to ensure the smooth flow of traffic. Parents are requested to fetch their children in time.



## HOMEWORK POLICY

Homework is a constructive tool in the teaching/learning process, geared to the needs and abilities of students, for the reinforcement of matter learnt in school. It is also intended to help students develop independent study habits.

Children are expected to spend no more than 60 minutes doing their homework. The school tries to assign interesting homework based on matter that has been covered and distributes it uniformly among various subjects per week.

### **Students should:**

- Ensure that they are prepared with whatever stationery supplies are needed for homework.
- Give their parents sufficient notice, if any extra material is needed for projects and other such home assignments, so that these can be acquired without inconvenience.
- Create, with the help of their parents, an appropriate environment at home for quiet study without disruption.
- Earmark a regular block of time for homework. If no homework is assigned they should maintain the routine, by reviewing class work or reading a book during the time assigned for homework.
- Ensure that their homework assignments are completed on time and that all supporting books and materials are carried back to school.
- Seek assistance from their parents only when specifically required, as per instructions from their teacher.
- Ask their parents, on a daily basis, to review their homework tasks, show them the completed work and ensure that they sign the almanac.

Seek their parents' help to list the things they did not understand, so that they can share these with their teacher at school the next day.

# EXAMINATION and EVALUATION SYSTEM

Students from Std. I to XII will be assessed on the basis of the New System of Assessment Examination by CBSE.

## STD. I to VIII

The session is divided into two terms, **Term-I** from June to October and **Term-II** from November to March. Students will be assessed separately in both the terms; each term will have one **Periodic Test** (out of 20 / 40 marks) and one **Half Yearly Examination or Annual Examination** (out of 80 marks each). The average of Periodic test marks aggregated to 10% will be added in the Internal Assessment (IA). There will be five **Subject Enrichment Activities** for every subject in both the terms, marks out of 5 will be awarded and average of them will be added in the Internal Assessment (IA). **Note books** will be verified on a regular basis and marks will be awarded out of 5 and the same will be added in the Internal Assessment (IA).

Music, Dance and Art & Craft will be assessed through one each tests conducted during Half Yearly Examination and Annual Examination. The total marks obtained out of 100 in each term will carry 80 marks of Half Yearly or Annual Examination and 20 marks of Internal Assessment (IA).

Students will be graded in a 8 point grading scale for Scholastic Areas and 3 point grading scale for Co - Scholastic Areas.

## STD IX & X

Students will have to appear in the Annual Examination covering the entire syllabus at the end of the session & in order to pass they need to secure minimum 33% marks separately in Annual Examination & Internal Assessment. The Academic Session will comprise of 2 Periodic Tests (Out of 40) & Half Yearly and Annual Examination (Out of 80), the average of the Best 2 marks of Unit Test & one Half Yearly Examinations aggregated to 10% will be added in the Internal Assessment. There will be two subject enrichment activities for every subject in both the terms, marks out of 5 will be awarded and average of these will be added in the internal assessment. Note books will be verified on a regular basis and marks will be awarded out of 5 and the same will be added in the internal assessment. The total marks obtained out of 100 will carry 80 marks of Annual Examination and 20 marks of Internal Assessment. Students will be graded in an 8 point grading scale for scholastic areas and 5 point grading scale for co-scholastic areas.
